Roll Call

Meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm

1. Consideration of a motion to approve the Minutes for the meeting of October 2, 2018. Motion was made, second and passed 6 – 0, Van De Ven Abstained.
2. Discussion and consideration of:
 - a. Centennial Park Kiosk Update - Yogerst will reach out to Jack Sullivan about when the bulletin boards will be put up. Yogerst will reach out to Tiffany Stram, Ice Age Trail Alliance, to see how it is going with updating the map of Hartland's parks and trails. Yogerst will look at the Kiosk at Nixon Park and see if there is any way to fix the condensation in the Nixon Park kiosk.
 - b. Moonlight Hike – Review of event Georgson said it was over whelming because about 80 people attended the event. It was noted that some people didn't come prepared. Participants didn't have head lamps or lights. Ideas include having a band, sign up in advance and to limit the people who are attending.
 - c. Operating Budget Update – Yogerst stated that the Village Board approved \$1,000 to be dedicated to the Ice Age Trail Community Committee.
 - d. IATC Partner Program - Muenzenberger recapped what the IATCC discussed at the October 2, 2018 meeting. A request was to put a version on the partner pamphlet. Muenzenberger noted changes that were made and updated to the partner pamphlet. Muenzenberger also recapped questions that the IATCC committee asked. One idea was dedicated a website to the partners. The ideas the IATCC was brought to the BID, Business Improvement District. The BID members thought the ideas and benefits were good that were on the pamphlet. One concern brought up by BID is bathrooms. Businesses usually only allow customers to use the bathrooms. Businesses might want to have a tent at events: Moonlight Walk, National Trails Day or any event the IATCC is part of or hosting. Muenzenberger distributed out a form of businesses that are interested in being a partner. It was brought up going to other businesses to see if they are interested in becoming a partner. Muenzenberger will reach out to other businesses. Yogerst will talk to Dave Dean, Hartland Fire Chief and owner of a Bed and Breakfast in Hartland to see if he wants to be a partner. Van Thiel asked if there are a list of business owners that the IATCC can get to reach out to owners. One question that was raised was; does the IATCC put together a document of places that have been approached? Reason beings so we don't reproach them again. Muenzenberger can do the BID district but needs help with the outer layers of Hartland, like Hartbrook Drive. All businesses should have a chance to be a partner. Muenzenberger will get a hold of a list of businesses and their owners. Yogerst will reach out to Cindy Gardner, from Hartland Business Improvement District for list of the businesses and managers/owners in the BID

- e. Paul Decker, Waukesha County Supervisor Muenzenberger talked to Paul Decker about cleaning up Bark River north of Hartbrook Park. Paul Decker said he might be a good resource to get groups together to work on this. Get a workforce together. Van De Ven said we can get him involved. Muenzenberger will reach out to Paul Decker.
3. Future meeting topics. Next meeting will be February 5, skipping January. Other topics for future meetings will be the Bark River Clean up between Hartbrook and Centennial with Paul Decker. IATCC members are asked to start thinking of ways to spend \$1,000.
