Meeting was called to order at 6:01 pm by Jim Muenzenberger.

1. Consideration of a motion to approve the minutes for the meetings of October 5th & November 2, 2021.

October minutes need to be approved again due to non-committee member motion the first time it was approved.

a. Discussion and consideration of buying more Ice Age Trail Pins-

Dr. Jim said at the previous meeting \$300 was the amount approved for Ice Age Trail Pins however the cost is \$4.75 per pin. Yogerst said there is \$1130 currently in the budget. She said what we know for cost so far this year is \$60 for QR code which leaves \$1070 in the budget and if you subtract \$475 that would leave \$595.00 in the budget.

Motion (Romagna/Callies) to buy 100 more Ice Age Trail pins not to exceed \$500.

Romagna said he is still doing hikes every 2nd week of the month. Callies said the Tyke hike will be the 1st Saturday of the month with the 1st one being January 8th at Centennial. Another one will be February 5th at Nixon Park and they are hoping to promote the Ice Rink as part of that. She said the Tyke Hikes are scheduled through May. Yogerst said in the program guide, she advertised for a Night Hike on January 14th and will go from the Library to KE and then back with the hike being approximately 5 miles. Everyone will meet at Nixon Park at 6:30pm.

Motion (Callies/Romagna) to approve to buy hot chocolate for the event and to not exceed \$50.
