1858 hours meeting called to order by Commission President Loppnow.

Commission Secretary Riesinger read the roll for attendance,
Present: Commissioners Loppnow, Rebholz, Riesinger, Deboer,
In attendance: Police Chief Torin Misko, Fire Chief David Jambretz.

Pledge of Allegiance led by Commission President Loppnow.

1. Consideration of a motion to approve the Board of Police and Fire Commission minutes for the meeting of 11 October 2022,
 - 1.1 Motion by Commissioners Rebholz | Deboer to approve the Board of Police and Fire Commission minutes for the meeting of 11 October 2022 – carried.
2. Fire Department Report: Fire Chief Jambretz,
 - 2.1 Experienced 1067 calls this year, calls are up by +96 from 2021,
 - 2.2 Ambulance 4351 involved in a deer accident, deer walked away and the ambulance is still operable,
 - 2.3 2023 budget for Service staff financial pay has been approved,
 - 2.4 Zimmerman Group is set to evaluate the Fire Station,
 - 2.5 Christmas Staff Party found a number of staff receiving awards for their efforts in 2022 all participants enjoyed the celebration.
3. Police Department Report: Police Chief Misko,
 - 3.1 Holiday Train celebration was well attended by the Village steady flow of participants during the event,
 - 3.2 Shop-with-a-Cop program went well and was very successful,
 - 3.3 Zimmerman Group meeting assessment is planning to create a concept drawing from all the discussed ideas toward a new building, or to remodel the existing building,
 - 3.4 Officer Tyler Martin graduated from WCTC recruit class,
 - 3.5 Police Dept Drug-Takeback program took in approximately 587 pounds,
 - 3.6 City of Waukesha awarded Officer Bell with a pin for his assistance with the Waukesha Christmas Parade incident,
 - 3.7 Mansfield emergency incident still under investigation; however, the two adults are ruled a suicide and the children are ruled murder,
 - 3.8 One of the Village squads is out on recall with Soren Ford,
 - 3.9 State Grant offers the Village to purchase video capability for the department. The Chief is reviewing a decision to move forward with video implementation in the squads,
 - 3.10 Chief is conducting research toward a School Resource Office for the Village.
